



Andrew Fraknoi recently retired after 40+ years of teaching introductory astronomy, at Foothill College, San Francisco State University, and Canada College. Currently, he teaches courses for retired adults at SF State and the University of San Francisco. He served as the Executive Director of the Astronomical Society of the Pacific from 1978 to 1994, creating a series of national astronomy education programs and materials. He is the lead author of “Astronomy,” a free, electronic, introductory textbook, published by the non-profit OpenStax Project, several books for teachers, and two books for children. He has served on the Board of Trustees of the SETI Institute since its beginnings, and is on the Advisory Board of *Breakthrough: Listen*, chairing its subcommittee on education and outreach. Recently, he has begun writing science fiction based on good astronomy, and two of his stories have now been published in anthologies. He has been the recipient of the AIP’s Gemant Award, the NSTA’s Faraday Award, and the AAS Education Prize; Asteroid 4859 has been named Asteroid Fraknoi to recognize his work in science popularization.
