Dr. Kathryn Denning is an Associate Professor of Anthropology at York University, where she teaches courses ranging from the Anthropology of Outer Space to Archaeology & Society and the Anthropology of Im/mortality. Her PhD was in Archaeology and Prehistory, but since 2004 her research has focused on the social issues connected to astrobiology and SETI, Mars simulations, the evolution of intelligence and civilizations on Earth, and contemporary ideas concerning the colonization of space. Her anthropological field sites have included the Mars Desert Research Station (yay Crew 78!), and the Green Bank observatory. She has collaborated within the NASA Astrobiology Institute (including co-leading the Astrobiology & Society Focus Group, and projects on Intelligence in Astrobiology) and the SETI Institute, and has been an active member of the IAA SETI Committee, and several interstellar groups. She has presented her space-related work widely to scholarly audiences (e.g. Library of Congress, Royal Society UK, IAC, AbSciCon, EU Science:GC2) and at many events for the general public.
